Special Aspects

This year's Hampshire County count was dedicated to the memory of Lavinia Schoene, who died shortly before the count after a brief illness with cancer. Vini had participated in or been the compiler of the count for most of its 51 years. Vini would have loved count morning this year: the mountains were sheathed in ice from a storm the night before, and as the sun came up and temperatures rose the ice fell from tree branches, filling valleys with a tinkling sound. Despite the pandemic, we had 21 participants, and they birded long and hard (socially distanced, of course). Some results were notable: we tied highs for 6 species: Song Sparrow, Wood Duck, Common Merganser, Rock Dove, Phoebe and Kestrel. The Kestrel number was especially appreciated, because that species has been in noticeable decline in the area. We also had a Golden Eagle this year, which was nice; Goldens are regularly seen in the area over the winter, but we hadn't been able to spot one during the count period for some time. We also had a remarkable sighting of 8 immature Bald Eagle feeding on a calf carcass in a pasture, as several adults soared nearby. It looked like something out of the Serengeti.
