BAEA 26 - Adult 18, Sub-adult 7, Unknown 1.

The warm weather this December and the high number of red cedar "berries" may have caused the large numbers of species like Yellow-rumped Warbler and may also explain the relatively low number of juncos. The large number of woodpeckers this year, is interesting, but I cannot propose a cause.

Editor's note: YRWA 247, previous WVPC high count 107, reported on the 118th CBC... the majority of this season's YRWA (136) were reported from one sector, the South of Brandywine sector.

Similarly, 25 of the 33 HETH and 21 of the 24 FO SP were reported from the South of Brandywine sector.
