Ash-throated Flycatcher [Myiarchus cinerascens]

Special Aspects

During the 1990 Charles Town CBC Wil Hershberger and Bob Dean found an Ash-throated Flycatcher near Shenandoah Junction, Jefferson Co., WV. It was accepted as the state record. During the Jan. 2, 2023, Charles Town CBC Wade Snyder and Phil Welser documented 2 Ash-throated Flycatchers that they had been observing in the vicinity for about 2 weeks prior to the count. One bird was tail-less when first observed but had regrown about 1/2 its tail length by count day. The two sightings are less than 3 miles apart.

Editor's notes: ATFL was documented with excellent photos and sound recordings.

A remarkable high count of BAEA (29) reported; 15 adults - 14 sub-adults.

A notable high count of YBSA (45) was also reported.
