

Bird was seen near two pole buildings and the walking path. Area surrounding the building was slightly weedy/low grass and largely open ground. Occasional patches of brush in this open area. The far side of this open ground was edged with taller trees of various types and heights.
Circumstances of observation: (Include details of distance to bird, ontics employed, lighting in relation to observer and the bird) First look was about 40 ft with binoculars in a lower branch of small tree close to one of the pole buildings. Eventually scoped high in the tree from 100 feet. We then carefully worked in on the open ground to about 40ft away while it was perched in higher tree branches. Lighting - partly cloudy day. Bird largely shaded by the trees. Not much green foliage, but numerous branches caused the shades. Pictures of bird (enclosed) digiscoped with iPhone 6.
