Special Aspects

Two new species for this count this year:

* Merlin, lengthy close observations of perched Merlin in good conditions the day before and the day after count day. Have details for rare bird report.

* American Pipit - 2 flocks observed by different groups, less than 5 miles apart in fields near Slanesville WV. One flock with 2 birds, the other with 15 birds. Both groups had birders who had seen Pipits before. Group observing larger flock in early morning was able to record calls. Second group saw the 2 birds in late afternoon. Have 2 rare bird reports.

* Barred Owl was count period, heard the night before.

* Relatively few Bald Eagles compared with recent years, likely because there was ample open water and few noticeable fresh deer or cow carcasses, so birds weren't concentrated because of frozen waterways or easy availability of carrion.

BAEA (10) Adult 4 subadult 6.

* The 42 total observers was a recent high. We haven't had that many birders in many years.

Five HC species: COHA, YBSA, WIWR, CEDW, YRWA.
