Bald Eagles: 4 adults and 2 juveniles.

All field participants reported very slow birding. They observed low numbers for most individual species. Low total species was due primarily to very few ducks on the river. Very few ducks have been observed in this area so far this year. Our six eagles were 4 adults and 2 juveniles.
