### Special Aspects

One observer reported seeing a Gray-cheeked Thrush although this is extremely unlikely for this time at this location. Light conditions were heavily overcast at the time and no photographs were obtained. On this listing, it is being submitted as Catharus sp., but the observer strongly believes in his identification based upon seeing this species many weeks before during the fall migration.

He has completed a rare bird observation report and this will be provided to the regional administrator.
