



The Nature Conservancy in West Virginia would like to invite you to a groundbreaking at Hungry Beech Preserve to celebrate the development of a 2.5-acre American Disability Act compliant loop trail. The event will be held at 1 p.m. July 10 at Hungry Beech Preserve. The Nature Conservancy recently was awarded \$83,400 from the American Water Charitable Foundation to support trail development and watershed conservation at the Hungry Beech Preserve. The American Water Charitable Foundation is an organization established by American Water, the largest regulated water and wastewater utility company in the U.S. Developing a trail at this preserve will allow easier access to beautiful cove forests, large boulder and cliff complexes and create a unique visitor experience. Located a short drive from Charleston, this will provide a nature experience to a wide group of residents and visitors while protecting headwater streams, ancient streams, ancient forests, and a unique assemblage of wildlife.
