SUMMER: Uncommon to Very Common Resident. Abundance depends on variable amount of preferred habitat available in any given year. Two hundred pairs in 1987 when construction at Byrd Locks & Dam temporarily created additional preferred habitat (WA, JF, MG). An estimated 250 pairs on 06 July 1996 at a sand/gravel pit at Gallipolis Ferry, Mason County, WV (WA) has been present through 2012. Colony present at Kyger Creek Power Plant in 2004 and 2005 and Gavin Power Plant from 2004 to 2011 (pers. commutation, DA)
