SUMMER: Uncommon Resident. Previously considered a common resident in appropriate habitat (Edeburn et al. 1960) and a fairly common resident by Kiff et al. (1986). None were recorded in Lawrence Co., OH, during the breeding bird atlas survey for the state of Ohio (Peterjohn 2001).

MIGRATION:

Spring: Uncommon Migrant during February into March.

Fall: Uncommon to Fairly Common Migrant from October into December. Early date, fifteen on 04 September 2003 (KK).
