### Special Aspects

Recorded Merlin and American Pipit for second year ever -- and for second straight year. Some of the Pipits were in same fields where they were spotted last year. New or tied highs for Yb Sapsucker, Pileated, Carolina Wren, E. Bluebird, A. Pipit and Yellow-rumped Warbler. White breasted Nuthatch near all-time high. Good turnout: 41 total birders. Weather looked bad in days before count, with heavy rain threatened. But count morning brought only fog and light rain, and it cleared as day went on. GOEA (1) adult. BAEA (16) ages were not noted.
