Special Aspects

The long-eared owl was found along interstate 48 the morning of the count by DNR wildlife biologist Kevin Oxenrider. It was reported to the state bird biologist by Mr. Oxenrider.

A large mixed flock of blackbirds was observed by a party of 8 and photos were taken. It was estimated to be approximately 700 birds. We estimated 45% Red-winged Blackbirds, 35 % Starlings and the rest Equal amounts of Brownheaded Cowbirds and Rusty Blackbirds.

An estimated 2500 Robins were observed by Darrell Good and Nevin Good flying over Moorefield at approximately 4P. M. on count day.
