#### **Special Aspects**

Due to a deer collision en route to the count circle on count day, the only birder for one of our sectors had to cancel. As a result his sector had no coverage this year. This may be a factor in the average to lower-than-average totals for several species.

The cedar fruit production was very low this year, which is probably why other species such as cedar waxwing and robin were lower than usual.

As expected in this irruption year, Red-breasted Nuthatches had a record high count, with 22 being found in 1 pine-rich sector of the count circle. Other irruptive species such as various winter finches had fairly low numbers or were absent.

Bald Eagles: 12 (6 adult, 5 immature, 1 not noted)

Golden Eagles: 4 (adult 3, immature 1)

The rarest species of the count this year was a Spotted Sandpiper in Franklin at the WTP photographed by James Fox and seen by other observers the following day. This was only the second sighting in the 41 years of this CBC. This eird list has photos: https://ebird.org/view/checklist/S50774422

Surprisingly, the Pine Warbler seen in pines in the Brandywine sector by Fred Atwood, was only the second one reported in the 41 years of this CBC. Yellow breast, greenish-yellow head and back, two white wing-bars, unstreaked back, white lower belly. No photo taken but bird seen well from 15 yards with 10X Zeiss binoculars in bright sunlight. Observer alerted to its presence by distinctive chip note. Foraging in mixed species flock of chickadees, rb nuthatches, gc kinglets, etc.
