The Point Pleasant CBC continues to grow year after year. We had a few folks return after a year of absence, and most of the core group continues to help out.

Birding was difficult despite some cozy late December weather. We picked up Red-headed Woodpecker as a new count species this year. A variety of waterfowl was seen at the Gallipolis Ferry Sandpit, as per usual.

The area along the Kanawha River on Rt. 817 continues to produce unusual species like Short-eared Owl and Palm Warbler.

Most groups reported that the birds went silent after noon, and the additional species tallies became scarce.

Overall, we were down in species numbers, but the WVPP count continues to produce a wide variety of birds in some of the best birding habitat in the state.
